

# VERTO FLORENCE STUDY CENTER

In Florence, you will study at a beautiful center near the heart of the historic district. Your study center is located at the following address:

Located in a historic 5-story building, the Florence Center includes classrooms, a basement movie room, lounge space, space to study in between classes, staff offices, and a top floor drawing room with incredible views of the city.

## What can you expect at the study center?

The study center is located in a lovely neighborhood, walking distance to restaurants, cafes, landmarks, and more. You will travel from your accommodations to class daily on foot, as most local Italian students do. The Florence study center is not a typical college campus like what you may be used to in the U.S., but a large building housing classrooms, student social space, and staff offices. This is the more common type of “campus” in Italy.

Very quickly, the center will become a home away from home; where you can chat with staff, take your classes, and socialize with other participants.

## What amenities are available?

Services and amenities within the study center include:

- Unlimited Wi-Fi throughout the building
- Possibility to print documents
- Quiet space
- Social areas
- Yoga and movie room
- Student life and travel information
- Staff office open Mon-Thu from 9:00am-6:00pm and Fridays 9:00am-5:00pm

## What is the layout of the study center?

You will enter the building and walk into a ground floor hallway leading to a reception area, staff offices, and classrooms. Through the main stairs you can proceed up to the first, second, and third floor, where a study area is available for students, as well as down to the basement where additional class space and lounge spaces are available.

On each floor, you will pass our classrooms, further quiet study space, advising rooms, and restrooms. Verto Staff will be available at all times the Verto Center is open.

## Commuting To and From the Study Center

The best way to get around Florence is on foot. In fact, you can walk from one end of the city center to the other in about 45 minutes, passing many recognizable sites along the way. The city center is small, easily accessible, and mostly pedestrian. Students should expect to commute on foot from housing to the study center and back to their accommodation or other locations in Florence.

Another option to consider is Ridemovi, a bike-sharing service easily accessible for locals, tourists, and students. This has an additional cost that you will need to keep in mind.
