ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY SUMMARY

The summary below highlights the key features of Verto Education's Academic Eligibility for New Students Policy.

Upon enrollment to a Verto program location, Verto Education verifies academic eligibility for all incoming participants in collaboration with the Verto Admissions and Enrollment Departments, based on established University of New Haven (UNewHaven) - Verto [Admissions](#) criteria.

Admissions Criteria - Academic Eligibility for New Participants

- GPA Requirements - GPA will be verified by Verto 2.0 GPA for non-degree seeking participants at the time of application
- 2.5 GPA for degree-seeking participants at time of application
 - Degree-seeking status is determined by participant pathway; see full policy for additional details.
- International applicants and participants must meet Verto's academic provider's English Language Requirements and may be required to submit official translated documents to demonstrate proof of high school completion.

Transcripts

- Unofficial high school transcripts must be submitted to support eligibility verification during the admissions process.
- A final, official high school transcript confirming graduation is required before the program start date.

Additional eligibility reviews apply for international applicants and participants wishing to continue with Verto for more than one semester (see Continuing Student Policy).

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Overview

Verto Education is a study abroad experience program designed for first- and second-year college students. All participants must meet the admissions and academic requirements of our academic provider, the University of New Haven, to be enrolled at a Verto program location. Participants may enroll for up to three semesters in accordance with the appropriate academic policies, including the Continuing Student Eligibility Policy.

Academic Requirements for Admission to UNewHaven

Admission to the University of New Haven occurs upon application to Verto for participants meeting all Admissions criteria or those approved through the review process.

Admission Requirements

All participants must meet the established UNewHaven-Verto [Admissions](#) criteria below.

All Participants

All new applicants must meet the following academic requirements:

- Meet the established, verified High School GPA admissions requirements:
 - Minimum 2.5+ High School GPA, Degree-Seeking
 - Minimum 2.0+ High School GPA, Non-Degree Seeking
- All participants are required to accurately self-report GPA and provide an unofficial transcript to the Verto Registrar for GPA verification and course eligibility evaluation during the application or admission process.
 - Participants who do not provide an unofficial transcript may delay their ability to complete course selection or remain enrolled in a Verto experience.
 - Participants with AP, IB, and/or other postsecondary credits must submit relevant academic records for course eligibility consideration.
- Submit a final, official high school transcript to the Verto Registrar (registrar@vertoeducation.org).
 - Participants who do not provide a final, official transcript by the required dates are subject to unenrollment / cancellation before the start of the program.

- Completion of all high-school graduation requirements before arrival at a Verto study abroad experience.

International Applicants and Participants

Verto welcomes international applicants and participants who meet Verto's Academic Providers' [English language requirements](#). Additional visa/immigration considerations may apply. Please notify the Verto Admissions team to discuss further and provide verification of English language proficiency and citizenship.

International applicants may be required to submit a supplemental credential evaluation or official translation of international academic records. Verto recommends World-Education Services (<https://www.wes.org/>) for credential evaluations and DuoLingo for English language scores for non-native English / speakers of other languages. Records should be directly submitted to Registrar@vertoeducation.org.
