

Czech Republic Student Visa FAQs

A student visa is a permit that allows foreigners to study in the issuing region for an established period of time. The student visa is issued in the form of a sticker affixed to a page in the passport.

| Who needs a visa? | Most non-EU citizens studying in Czech Republic for more than 90 days are required to apply for a student visa. Verto advises US passport holders on the student visa application process. Non-U.S. citizens must contact their nearest Czech Republic consulate to verify entry requirements. |

| What application materials are needed? | The complete list of documents required is located on each consulate's website. Please review your specific Consulate requirements via the Verto Enrolled Participants (Location Resources) and Consulate websites |
| When do I apply? & will you receive your passport back? | It is recommended to start the process 4 -6 months before your Verto program begins. The Czech Republic Consulate will take approximately 60-90 days to process your visa. These processing times are NOT guaranteed |
| Where do I apply? | Participants must apply at the consulate that governs the region of their permanent address via their drivers license address. |
| How much does it cost? | The cost ranges from \$105-\$120 for US citizens, which must be provided in the form of a U.S. Postal Service Money Order Or Online Payment system (depending on the consulate requirements). |
